What should I bring to the camp?

What other activities are there on the camp grounds?

How many campers are there joining this camp?

The camp is limited to 10 pairs of dads and sons.

Can I bring both my sons with me?

The camp is designed to help dads to bond with each son individually. Having 2 sons together will definitely change the dynamics and may not reach this objective. We would recommend taking one son at a time. This will make the getaway something for each son to look forward to.

Will the camp be similar to the previous year's camp?

What is the registration process?
